Lamentations

Summary: Author (Jeremiah?) laments destruction of Jerusalem

- Key Passage: 3: 19-26 Magnitude of God's mercy

Ezekiel

Summary: Prophet to Judah around exile; went into exile himself; famous for his eccentricity.

- A. (1-24) Oracles explaining God's judgment of Jerusalem & Judah in the exile
 - B. (25-32) Oracles against the nations
 - C. (33-38) Oracles of hope for Judah & Israel
 - D. (39-48) Renewal of worship in new Temple
- Key Passage: 36: 24-28 God's Spirit will dwell in the hearts of his people

Daniel

Summary: Prophet at the end of the exile

- A. (1-7) Visions of the nations and their fates
 - B. (8-12) Vision of Israel and its hope
- Key Passage: 7: 13-14 Vision of the Messiah

Hosea

Summary: Prophet to Northern Kingdom Israel

- A. (1-3) Unfaithful wife of the prophet, yet he is an abidingly loyal husband
- B. (4-14) Unfaithful people of Israel, yet God is loyal to them like a husband or a father

Key Passage: 3:1 God's love despite sin

Joel

Summary: Prophet to Judah; about the 'Day of the LORD'

- A. (1-2nd) Judgment on Judah in the form of locusts; calls for repentance
- B. (2nd-3) Judah will be saved in the day of final reckoning

Key Passage: 2: 28-32 God will put his Spirit on all people who call upon his name

Amos

Summary: Early prophet to Judah (c. 775); emphasis on social justice

- A. (1-2) Judgments against the Nations
 - B. (3-6) Judgment against Israel
 - C. (7-9) Divine retribution but final restoration
- Key Passage: 5: 21-24 True religion

Obadiah

Summary: Judgment against the nation of Edom for gloating over Israel's defeat

Key Passage: 1: 15-18 Hope for deliverance

Jonah

Summary: Prophet to Nineveh; (in Assyria) flees but finally fulfills God's mission

- A. (1-2) Jonah flees; swallowed by fish, delivered
- B. (3-4) Jonah preaches; Nineveh repents; Jonah questions

Key Passage: 3: 10-4: 4 God has compassion on Gentiles

Micah

Summary: Prophet to Judah (c. 700)

- A. (1-3) Judgment against Israel & Judah
 - B. (4-5) Hope for Israel & Judah
 - C. (6) God's case against Judah
 - D. (7) Final triumph of Judah and God's people
- Key Passage: 6: 8-9 Nature of true religion

Nahum

Summary: Prophet foretells demise of Nineveh, the capital of Assyria (c. 612)

Habakkuk

Summary: Foretells the ascendancy of Babylon

Zephaniah

Summary: Prophet to Judah about the 'Day of the Lord' on the Judah and the nations

Haggai

Summary: Post-exile prophet who calls the people to rebuild the temple
